Annex: Indicators for Specified Tasks

- 1. In the 2024 Policy Address, I set a total of 138 indicators for specified tasks, of which 72 were new. This has helped foster the Government's result-oriented culture and enabled me to monitor work progress and outcomes more effectively.
- 2. I have reviewed the implementation of these indicators, including "tasks completed" (covering several tasks which are completed by now but with delay in the interim), "tasks on track", and even "tasks exceeding targets" 26. For the three indicators that have yet to be completed as scheduled, they all have reasonable causes for the delay. Their positions are as follows:
 - (i) Take forward the development of the Northern Metropolis by announcing specific suggestions in Q1 2025 on the formation of a company by the Government for operating a pilot industry park in an NDA.

While preparing the Budget in February this year, the Government noted that a tender was in progress for the lot adjacent to the sites for the industry park in Hung Shui Kiu to be rolled out by the DEVB. Since announcing the actual site location of the industry park and details of the company may compromise the fairness of the tender exercise, the Financial Secretary's consent was obtained to release details of the company for the pilot industry park after completion of the tender exercise.

After reviewing the situation, the Government considered that the said lot, which had been put up for tender and was located on the skirt outside the industry park in Hung Shui Kiu, should better be incorporated into the industry park to achieve economies of scale. The Government announced, on 21 July this year, the cancellation of the tender for the lot and the new proposed direction. The DEVB is revising the planning for the expanded new industry park and adjusting details of the park company. The DEVB will report to the Working Group on Devising Development and Operation Models to be established, as announced in this year's Policy Address, and announce the proposal within this year.

Such as the FSTB shall facilitate 200 family offices by end-2025 but it has completed the task in August; and the CEDB shall attract 1 130 companies by end-2025, yet the indicator has been met ahead of schedule reaching 1 365 companies, bringing about \$175.4 billion of investment and 19 900 job opportunities.

(ii) Expedite urban renewal by formulating in the first half of 2025 policy proposals on the use of newly developed land to drive large-scale urban redevelopment projects.

After examining the proposals submitted by the DEVB in mid-2025, the Chief Executive considered that the measures related to the URA's Flat-for-Flat Scheme were not specific enough, and that the incentives targeting areas with a more pressing need for redevelopment could be enhanced, so that private redevelopment projects could be taken forward more effectively. The Chief Executive directed the DEVB to further study the matter and submit refined proposals within two months. The DEVB submitted refined proposals in late August this year, which were agreed by the Chief Executive and incorporated for promulgation in paragraphs 219(ii) and (iii) of this year's Policy Address.

(iii) Set up the Teacher Professional Development Fund in the 2024/25 school year (i.e. from September 2024 to August 2025) to continuously enhance the training and exchange programmes for teachers.

In the Budget announced in February 2025, the Government proposed revising the financial arrangements for six seed capital funds, each with a relatively large unspent balance, as well as reviewing the financial arrangements for 36 funds.

Since the review would take time to complete and its results might have a chain effect on the Teacher Professional Development Fund, the EDB considered that it could use its existing resources to provide teacher professional development programmes until the 2027/28 school year. The EDB therefore halted the setting up of the fund and reported the situation at the meeting of the LegCo Panel on Financial Affairs in April 2025. Its action was supported by the Chief Executive and the Financial Secretary.

- 3. In addition, last year's Policy Address put forward to complete the statutory environmental impact (EIA) procedures for the reclamation works under the Kau Yi Chau Artificial Islands project within this year. While the relevant EIA Report was made ready last year, given the implementation programme of the Kau Yi Chau project has been slowed down and no specific arrangements have been made, the DEVB, after reviewing the situation, considers it inappropriate to proceed with the relevant statutory EIA procedures at this stage, but will complete the ongoing studies so that the analysis and information acquired may be retained for reference. The Financial Secretary and I accept and agree to it.
- 4. For this year's Policy Address, I have set a total of 140 indicators, including 79 new indicators, and 61 indicators introduced in the 2024 Policy Address that are in progress and still valid. Details are as follows:

Indicators for Specified Tasks in 2025 Policy Address

(I) New Indicators

Safeguard National Security

- 1. Undertake promotional, outreach and educational initiatives for safeguarding national security, including:
 - Stage a drama performance promoting the message of safeguarding national security to the public **in 2026**; (SB)
 - Recruit around 80 volunteers from the Security Bureau Youth Uniformed Group Leaders
 Forum in the 2025/26 school year to participate in the "Andy and Security Bear"
 themed education workshops in various kindergartens for promoting national security

Strengthen Students' Affection for and Sense of Belonging to the Country

 - Provide 1 500 teacher training places and continue to provide learning and teaching resources for the senior secondary Chinese History and History curricula in the 2026/27 school year. (EDB)

Further Enhance Governance

- 3. The Civil Service Bureau will introduce enhancement measures **in 2026** to improve the civil service performance appraisal system for differentiating staff performance in a clearer manner, so as to strengthen the reward and punishment system. (CSB)
- 4. Formulate the work plan and timetable of the AI Efficacy Enhancement Team in Q4 2025, and to implement relevant projects in 2026, including the rolling out of AI tools covering 100 public administration procedures within 2026, and the launch of AI Flagship Projects²⁷ progressively in 2026-27 and 2027-28. (DCSO)

- 55. Press ahead with the tendering of the smart and green mass transit system project in Kai Tak with a view to awarding the contract; and invite tenders for the projects in East Kowloon and the Hung Shui Kiu/Ha Tsuen NDA within 2026. (TLB)

- Expand the Healthy Mind Pilot Project by phases to cover **six** more DHCs (i.e. a total of nine DHCs) **starting from 2026**; (HHB)
- Submit the report on Stepped Care Model on Mental Health by the end of 2025; and (HHB)
- Introduce a special recognition category under the Mental Health Workplace Charter in 2026 to commend schools and organisations for arranging a specific number of staff members to receive training in relation to mental health. (HHB)

Green and Low-carbon Living Environment

- 64. Enhance the electric vehicle (EV) charging network:
 - Provide 3 000 fast chargers under the Fast Charger Incentive Scheme by end-2028; and
 - Plan for the tendering for the conversion of six petrol filling station sites into fast charging stations by end-2026. (EEB)
- 65. Enhance waste reduction and recycling:
 - Formulate the relevant subsidiary legislation regarding the producer responsibility schemes on EV batteries, plastic beverage containers and beverage cartons. The consultation with industries is underway and, in the light of the actual situation, the LegCo Panel on Environmental Affairs will also be consulted within 2026; and
 - Gradually transform the operation of 82 Recycling Stores into self-service smart recycling facilities by end-2026 as regards the community recycling network of GREEN@COMMUNITY. (EEB)
- 66. Develop the GBA into an international first-class beautiful bay area, and complete the following initiatives by end-2027:
 - Further improve the water quality of key waterfront areas, and reduce the amount of sewage discharged at highly polluted outfalls by half, using 2022 as the base year; and
 - Include Mirs Bay and Port Shelter of the HKSAR in the List of National "Beautiful Bays". (EEB)

Support the Local Economy

- 67. Enhance support for SMEs:
 - To launch internal guidelines on the new "joint-vetting" mechanism to expedite applications for outside seating accommodation of restaurants in Q4 2025 for implementation by departments; (DCSO, EEB)
 - Expand the geographical scope of the BUD Fund to cover **eight** more economies, including B&R countries **within 2026**; and (CEDB)
 - Implement the enhanced Digital Transformation Support Pilot Programme within 2026 to provide SMEs with subsidies on a matching basis to enable them to apply basic and practical AI and cybersecurity solutions. (ITIB)
- 68. Introduce a new, unified brand for local agricultural and fisheries products **in mid-2026** to enhance the competitiveness of local produce. (EEB)
- 69. Grant permission to the first batch of restaurants that can allow dogs to enter **in mid-2026**. (EEB)

Labour Support and Protection

- 70. Collaborate with the Employees Retraining Board (ERB) to take forward reform in the medium to long term, including renaming the ERB and amending the Employees Retraining Ordinance to reflect its new positioning, with the target of completing the legislative amendments by mid-2027. (LWB)
- 71. Release the results of the mid-term update of the manpower projections **in 2026** to provide the latest information on the manpower situation in relation to the key industries driving Hong Kong's economic growth and essential services supporting the city's operation. (LWB)
- 72. Submit legislative proposals for improving the work injury compensation mechanism for digital platform workers through legislation **within 2026**. (LWB)

Targeted Poverty Alleviation

73. Launch the fourth cohort of the Strive and Rise Programme **by end-2025**, enabling no less than **70**% of mentees who have completed the one-year programme to achieve improvement in terms of personal development and positive thinking. (LWB)

Establish a Working Group on Ageing Society Strategies

74. To hold the first meeting of the Working Group on Ageing Society Strategies in Q4 2025 and submit a report in 2026. (DCSO)

Promote Fertility

75. Introduce a bill into the LegCo in 2026 to extend the claim period of additional child allowance for newborns from one year to two years. (FSTB)

Protect Children and Provide Support for Students

- 76. Promote positive parent education:
 - Launch the Workplace Parent Education Programmes in the 2025/26 school year to encourage working parents to participate in parent education activities; and
 - Launch the Parent Education Resource Package for Secondary Schools in 2026 to further support schools in implementing school-based parent education programmes. (EDB)

Provide Support for Ethnic Minorities

- 77. Strengthen the support for ethnic minorities (EMs):
 - Set up one additional EM Care Team in the North District and Islands District respectively in 2026 to provide services for EMs moving into the new development areas more effectively; (HYAB)

- Establish a Youth Network and a Women's Network at the 10 Support Service Centres
 for EMs in 2026 and organise activities specifically for EM youth and women to benefit
 no less than 4 000 attendances annually; and (HYAB)
- Extend the pilot project for **two years** to provide emotional support and counselling service for EMs **in 2026**. (HHB)

Improve Building Management

- 78. Introduce a pilot scheme **in the first half of 2026** to enhance the inspection and testing procedures for handling water seepage problems. (DCSO)
- 79. **By end-2025**, the FSD will launch the Pilot Scheme on the Internet of Things (IoT) fire detection system, under which IoT fire detection system and fire extinguishers will be installed as an alternative to traditional fire service installations and equipment. (SB)

 - Conduct focus inspections on national education in at least **50** schools to enhance the quality and effectiveness of national education;
 - Provide training places for about 1 000 junior secondary Chinese History teachers who are not major in History;

- Provide no less than 40 itineraries for students to experience the founding history of our country through Mainland exchange programmes and study tours; and

Promote the Development of the New Energy Industry

- 4. Promote new energy development:
 - Set a usage target for sustainable aviation fuel within 2025 to speed up the reduction of carbon emissions by the aviation industry; (TLB)
 - Formulate the approach of hydrogen standard certification suitable to Hong Kong by **2027 or earlier**; and (EEB)
 - Establish hydrogen filling facilities in the Hong Kong Island, Kowloon and the New Territories by 2027 or earlier. (EEB)

Deepen International Exchanges and Co-operation

- 5. Continue to promote Hong Kong as the functional platform for the B&R Initiative in 2026:
 - Organise promotional programmes and networking sessions to be attended by no less than 7 500 persons in total;
 - Reach out to no less than **560** professional and business associations, chambers and community groups; and
 - Organise business missions to five B&R countries with about **120** participants in total. (CEDB)
- 6. Organise about **20** professional anti-corruption training programmes for anti-corruption and related organisations worldwide and about **10** training programmes for local public and private sectors **within 2026**, benefitting around **2 000** members of these parties. (ICAC)

Development of the Greater Bay Area

7. Take forward the setting up of a GBA legal information platform within the first half of 2026 to foster collaboration in the GBA. (DoJ)

International Trade Centre

- 8. Seek early accession to the Regional Comprehensive Economic Partnership (RCEP) by holding or participating in **70** related events to liaise with RCEP members and stakeholders within **2026**. (CEDB)
- 9. Continue to promote opportunities in the GBA within 2026 by organising and participating in promotional programmes and networking sessions to be attended by no less than 10 500 participants, reaching out to no less than 1 250 entrepreneurs and representatives of business firms. (CMAB)

10. Continue to promote Hong Kong's strengths and opportunities in the Mainland via the Mainland Offices in 2026 by organising no less than 3 400 visits to Mainland authorities or bodies, attending no less than 290 speaking occasions, conducting no less than 350 media interviews or briefings, and participating in no less than 880 business and trade meetings. (CMAB)

International Aviation Hub

11. Expand the Flight Token service to cover 80% of the departing passengers at the HKIA within 2026 to enable them to use facial recognition for passage through various checkpoints at the airport. (TLB)

Build an International Education Hub

- 12. Participate in **three** international education exhibitions annually to promote the "Study in Hong Kong" brand via collaboration with local post-secondary institutions, with a view to promoting the development of an international post-secondary education hub. (EDB)
- 13. Promote STEAM education in primary and secondary schools:
 - Provide at least 8 000 places for relevant competitions and training organised by the Hong Kong Academy for Gifted Education in the 2025/26 school year;
 - At least **700** schools to participate in the Quality Education Fund e-Learning Funding Programme annually **in the 2025/26 to 2026/27 school years**; and
 - Arrange for at least one Mathematics teacher in each publicly-funded secondary school
 to undergo professional development training on mathematical modelling by the end of
 the 2025/26 school year. (EDB)
- 14. Enhance support for schools, teachers and students:
 - Arrange for at least 40 Mainland expert teachers to Hong Kong every school year and introduce cross-curricular support initiatives; and
 - Implement the Navigators for Excellence in Education Training Programme on a three-year pilot basis **starting from the 2024/25 school year** for **50** potential leading teachers and principals each year. (EDB)
- 15. Continue to enhance post-secondary education by encouraging University Grants Committee (UGC)-funded universities to increase relevance of their programmes to future economic development such that:
 - Students in UGC-funded universities studying in STEAM disciplines (Science, Technology, Engineering, the Arts and Mathematics) will reach around **35% by the 2026/27 academic year**;
 - Students in UGC-funded universities studying in disciplines relevant to "the eight centres" will reach around 60% by the 2026/27 academic year; and
 - Provide opportunities of learning experience outside Hong Kong for around 50% of local undergraduate students of UGC-funded universities within the 2025/26 academic year. (EDB)

International Innovation and Technology Centre

- 16. Set up research and development (R&D) centres under the third InnoHK research cluster progressively **starting from the first half of 2026**, with the focus on sustainable development, energy, advanced manufacturing and materials. (ITIB)
- 17. Promote start-up and talent development:
 - Increase under the Innovation and Technology Venture Fund the cumulative private investment attracted for local I&T start-ups from \$1.7 billion in 2022 to no less than \$4 billion in 2027 to nurture start-ups;
 - Increase the cumulative number of applications approved for subsidising the recruitment of R&D talents under the Research Talent Hub Scheme from around 10 500 in 2022 to 18 500 in 2027; and
 - Increase the number of student interns under the STEM Internship Scheme from 3 000 in 2022 to 5 000 in 2027. (ITIB)

18. Promote new industrialisation:

- Increase under the New Industrialisation Funding Scheme the cumulative number of funded smart production lines in Hong Kong from about 30 in 2022 to no fewer than 130 in 2027, with the corresponding cumulative skilled employment opportunities increasing from about 260 to no fewer than 1 050, and the cumulative matching private investment rising from about \$340 million to no less than \$1.3 billion during the same period;
- Double the supply of floor area for advanced manufacturing in the InnoParks from no less than 100 000 square metres in 2022 to no less than 200 000 square metres in 2027; and
- Attract 50 to 100 enterprises to set up new smart production facilities in Hong Kong with a corresponding direct investment of no less than \$20 billion from these enterprises under the New Industrialisation Acceleration Scheme starting from 2024-25 over a period of five to eight years. (ITIB)

Regional Intellectual Property Trading Centre

- 19. Continue to work towards the goal of acquiring institutional autonomy in conducting substantive patent examination in 2030 to foster the development of the patent system in Hong Kong. (CEDB)
- 20. Continue to forge ahead with the preparatory work for implementing the Protocol Relating to the Madrid Agreement Concerning the International Registration of Marks in Hong Kong in 2026. (CEDB)

- 21. Promote IP public education, human resources training and professional services within the five years **from 2022 to 2027** through the following measures:
 - Promote the awareness of respecting and protecting IP rights among 200 000 students;
 - Attract about **10 000** local, Mainland and overseas participants to attend the annual Business of IP Asia Forum. (CEDB)

Promote Youth Development

- 22. Continue to cultivate positive thinking of young people:
 - Nurture positive thinking of young people through youth-led projects involving cross-sectoral efforts to benefit no less than 30 000 attendances;
 - Provide systematic and quality adventure training activities to young people for no less than 50 000 attendances; and
 - No less than **70**% of responding participants to consider themselves having developed a positive outlook on life after joining any of the above projects or activities. (HYAB)
- 23. Enhance support for youth development:
 - Organise or provide at least 25 youth development activities for members of the Youth Link within 2026; and
 - No less than 70% of responding schools to consider the activities under the HYAB JC Scheme for Youth Life Planning (2025-28) useful in assisting participants in life planning and deepening their understanding of the opportunities brought by national development. (HYAB)
- 24. Continue to enhance youth participation in public affairs by increasing the number of participating advisory bodies under the Member Self-recommendation Scheme for Youth from over 60 in 2022 to no less than **180 by mid-2027**. (HYAB)
- 25. Continue to take forward the HYAB Funding Scheme for Youth Entrepreneurship in the GBA:
 - No less than 100 funded youth start-up teams in aggregate to have settled in Mainland cities of the GBA by 2026; and
 - No less than 80% of the participants surveyed to consider having enhanced their understanding of business start-up after joining the scheme. (HYAB)
- 26. Expand the Youth Hostel Scheme to hotels and guesthouses with a view to providing around 3 000 additional places between 2022 and 2027. (HYAB)

Develop a Talent Pool

27. To attract talents, approve at least **50 000** visa extension applications annually for talents admitted through talent admission schemes **from 2025 to 2027**, an increase of no less than 40% over the annual average from 2021 to 2023. (LWB)

- 28. Provide training allowance for no fewer than **7 000** registered apprentices and subsidise graduated apprentices in undertaking upskilling courses of relevant trades over a three-year period starting from the **2024/25** academic year. (LWB)
- 29. In 2026, the Hong Kong Talent Engage will:
 - Conduct **at least 20** outreach visits to the Mainland, Asia-Pacific, Europe, Middle East and North America regions to organise promotional activities for attracting talents; and
 - In collaboration with major Mainland cities, organise at least **one** promotional activity to promote regional development opportunities in attracting overseas talents. (LWB)

East-meets-West Centre for International Cultural Exchange

- 30. The Cultural and Creative Industries Development Agency to promote the development of the cultural and creative industries by the following initiatives:
 - Support cultural IP creators and producers to propel no less than **34** cultural IP projects cumulatively within five years starting from **2025**;
 - Drive Hong Kong design industries to participate in around 20 design weeks/fashion weeks/expos/exhibitions every year in the Mainland and overseas;
 - Promote 60 industry mission trips, overseas exhibitions and showcases each year, so as
 to open up more business opportunities for Hong Kong's arts and cultural and creative
 industries by assisting them to conduct business negotiations and organise exhibitions
 and showcases in Mainland and overseas markets;
 - Subsidise around 50 projects under the CreateSmart Initiative per year; and
 - Organise the Hong Kong Fashion Design Week **each year** to attract at least **40 000** participants and **500 000** online views. (CSTB)
- 31. Continue to implement the 10-year development blueprint for arts and cultural facilities for the improvement and development of cultural facilities with the following proposals:

Phase 1 (2022-2027)

- The total number of seats in performance venues is expected to increase from 30 000 to **34 000** (increase by 13%); and
- The average annual attendance of performance venues is expected to increase from about 3 million to about **3.4 million** (increase by 13%).

Phase 2 (2027-2032)

- The number of museums (including those under planning) is expected to increase from 15 to no less than **20** (increase by more than 33%);
- The average annual museum attendance is expected to increase from 5 million to 9 million (increase by 80%);

- The total number of seats in performance venues (including those under planning) is expected to increase from 30 000 to about **50 000** (increase by 67%); and
- The average annual attendance of performance venues is expected to increase from about 3 million to about 5 million (increase by 67%). (CSTB)
- 32. Promote the safeguarding and passing on of intangible cultural heritage (ICH), as well as the integrated development of culture and tourism by undertaking the following measures each year:
 - Review the bearers of the items on the Representative List of the ICH of Hong Kong and organise no less than 30 activities focusing on passing on, training, promotion, and cultural exchange; and
 - Organise Hong Kong ICH Month to promote Hong Kong's ICH to locals and tourists.

It is expected that at least 100 000 participants will join these activities each year. (CSTB)

Promote Sports Development

33. Continue to take forward the 10-year development blueprint on sports and recreation facilities with the following targets:

Phase 1 (2022-2027)

- 16 projects with implementation launched; and
- 15 projects with technical feasibility study launched.

Phase 2 (2027-2032)

• **15** projects (with technical feasibility established under Phase 1) with implementation launched. (CSTB)

Increase Housing Supply and Enrich the Housing Ladder

- 34. Regarding the issue of SDUs, the Rating and Valuation Department to continue to step up enforcement of tenancy control on SDUs in 2025-26 and 2026-27 by checking landlords of no less than 1 000 SDU households annually to see whether they have committed offences for regulated tenancies. (HB)
- 35. Allocate an extra ballot number to applicants who have failed to purchase an HOS flat in the last two consecutive sale exercises starting from the next HOS sale exercise, following the same practice adopted for the GSH 2024. (HB)
- 36. Allocate **an extra** ballot number to young family applicants and young one-person applicants aged below 40 with White Form status starting from the next HOS sale exercise, in order to support young people in purchasing SSFs. (HB)
- 37. Adjust the ratio between Green Form and White Form from the existing 40:60 to 50:50 starting from the next HOS sale exercise to encourage more public rental housing (PRH) tenants to buy HOS flats. (HB)

- 38. Establish a Centralised Estate Management and Analytics Platform in 10 selected estates starting from 2025-26, to bring digital technologies in their daily operation for enhancing management efficiency and service quality, in order to promote digitalisation of public housing management and facilitate the application of innovative technologies; and subsequently extend the platform to more housing estates. (HB)
- 39. Increase public housing supply:
 - Provide about **189 000** public housing units (including traditional PRH, LPH, GSH and HOS flats) in the five-year period **from 2026-27 to 2030-31**, which is comparable to that in the previous five-year period from 2025-26 to 2029-30;
 - Complete the remaining about 20 300 and about 200 LPH units in 2026 and the first half of 2027 respectively, ultimately achieving the target of completing the construction of a total of about 30 000 LPH units before 2027-28; and
 - Rationalise PRH resources by vetting no less than 450 000 Income and Assets Declaration Forms under the Well-off Tenants Policies within a two year cycle, and no less than 800 000 Declaration Forms on Occupancy Status and Particulars of Domestic Property Ownership in Hong Kong/Declaration Forms on Occupancy Status (starting from the declaration cycle in October 2023); and conduct in-depth investigation of no less than 10 000 households involving cases related to income and asset declaration and occupancy position per year. (HB)
- 40. Reduce the Composite Waiting Time for Subsidised Rental Housing to about **4.5 years in 2026-27**. (HB)
- 41. Improve estate facilities and management:
 - Complete the study and implementation of various improvement measures under the pilot projects of the "Well-being Design" Guide in five PRH estates by 2027; and
 - Select about 10 public housing estates for façade beautification and/or minor estate improvement works and about 20 public housing estates for landscape improvement projects every year. (HB)
- 42. Arrange for PRH applicants to move in earlier-than-scheduled by advancing the completion of around 10 000 PRH units by phases from 2025-26 to 2027-28, ultimately reaching a total of about 14 000 PRH units from 2023-24 to 2032-33. (HB)

Land Development

43. To promote the development of the construction industry, the Construction Industry Council has been utilising government funding and its own resources to increase the training quota for skilled construction workers from 10 000 places in the 2022/23 academic year to at least about 12 000 places in each of the academic years from 2023/24 to 2027/28. (DEVB)

- 44. Increase land supply:
 - Update and release annually the 10-year forecast of "spade-ready sites". Based on the
 latest forecast, in the next decade (2026-27 to 2035-36), get ready around 2 600 hectares of
 "spade-ready sites", among which around 1 800 hectares will come from the Northern
 Metropolis; and
 - Based on the latest forecast, resume around **840 hectares** of private land for government projects in five years **from 2025-26 to 2029-30**. (DEVB)

District Environment

- 45. Extend the total length of the promenade on both sides of the Victoria Harbour by no less than 30% from 25 kilometres as at 2022 to 34 kilometres by end-2028; and stage no less than 30 events/activities at harbourfront sites every year. (DEVB)
- 46. Progressively commence works for improving some sections and providing missing links of a 60-kilometre long Round-the-Island Trail from 2023 onwards, with a view to connecting 90% of the trail **by end-2027** and substantially completing the remaining larger scale works **by end-2031**. (DEVB)

Enhance Transport and Commuting Convenience

47. **Starting from 2024**, the automated car parks constructed by the AAHK on the artificial island of the Hong Kong-Zhuhai-Macao Bridge Hong Kong Port will be completed in phases for use by transit passengers or inbound visitors from Guangdong and Macao. Together with the newly completed government car parks and short-term tenancy car parks to be built **by 2026**, a total of no less than **3 000** automated parking spaces will be provided. (TLB)

Healthcare

- 48. Advance primary healthcare development:
 - Launch a community pharmacy programme by phases starting from Q4 2026; and
 - Provide dental services for elderly persons with financial difficulties through the Community Dental Support Programme within 2026, supplanting the dental service subsidy under the Community Care Fund. (HHB)
- 49. Strengthen public healthcare services:
 - Establish an electronic referral platform and develop clinical referral references in eight major specialties to enhance the triage system and ensure proper referrals in 2025-26; and
 - Increase the capacity of cataract surgeries by at least 5 000 in 2025-26. (HHB)
- 50. Introduce a draft regulation on enhancing the price transparency of private healthcare services into the LegCo in 2026 to enhance the quality of private healthcare services. (HHB)

Enhance Charging Networks for Electric Vehicles

51. Continue to promote green transport by increasing the total number of public and private parking spaces with charging facilities in Hong Kong to about **200 000 by mid-2027**. (EEB)

Promote the Development of the Agriculture and Fisheries Industries

52. Increase the local mariculture production by 100% as compared to 2022 within 2027. (EEB)

Enhance Occupational Safety and Health

53. Strengthen occupational safety and health: Reduce the five-year average industrial accident rate per 1 000 construction workers by at least 10% from 29.8 in 2021 to **26.8 in 2026**. (LWB)

Social Welfare

- 54. Continue to take forward the strategy of targeted poverty alleviation:
 - Complete the evaluation on the Pilot Programme on Community Living Room within 2025-26 with the target of enabling no less than 70% of service users to experience an enhancement in their living space, sense of belonging to the community and interpersonal networks; and (LWB)
 - Complete the comprehensive evaluation on the School-based After School Care Service Scheme in the 2025/26 school year with the targets of having no less than 70% of student beneficiaries who have completed the scheme to find that they have received more appropriate care and learning support, and no less than 70% of parent/guardian beneficiaries to find the scheme useful in reducing their child care pressure and enabling them to consider seeking/taking up jobs. (LWB, EDB)
- 55. Provide **6 200** additional subsidised residential care service places for the elderly **by end-2027**. (LWB)
- 56. Improve rehabilitation services and enhance the support for persons with disabilities:
 - Increase the number of rehabilitation (including day, residential and respite care) service places from about 37 300 in 2023-24 to **about 39 900 by 2028-29**; and
 - Gradually increase the number of Work Extension Programme places by about 800 within three years from 2024-25. (LWB)

Promote Fertility

57. To strengthen support for assisted reproductive services, HA will gradually increase the annual service quota for in-vitro fertilisation treatment from 1 100 to **1 800** treatment cycles within five years **starting from 2024-25**. (HHB)

58. Strengthen child care:

- Increase the number of beneficiaries under the Fee-waiving Subsidy Scheme of the After School Care Programme for low income families to 4 600 by the end of the 2026/27 school year, an increase of no less than 60% over the 2021/22 school year; and
- Further increase the number of Aided Standalone Child Care Centre service places for parents who cannot take care of their young children temporarily to about **2 000 by end-2027**, an increase of 94% over 2022-23. (LWB)

Improve Building Management

- 59. Launch the Joint Property Management Pilot Scheme within 2025 and complete a review of its effectiveness by 2026. (HYAB)
- 60. Introduce legislative amendments into the LegCo in the first half of 2026 to implement the mandatory design requirements for elderly-friendly buildings. (DEVB)
- 61. Introduce a bill into the LegCo in the first half of 2026 to amend the Buildings Ordinance for enhancing building safety. (DEVB)
